Chodesh 10 is here!

English novelist, journalist, sociologist, and historian HG Wells once wrote a book titled "The Time Machine" with its translucent commentary on the capitalist society *which* was an instant bestseller. A notable lesson one may glean from this booklet is expressed through the odyssey of the future, into a Golden Age that has lost its glitter, among a humanity that is searching for its humanness. It reveals to us that while some things change ... mostly things remain the same. In spite of our temporal affluence and technology human nature remains constant. Creatures of curious habit become creatures of victim. By false operant response conditioning and positive reinforcement humanity finds itself comfortably defined by the resulting [conditioned] customs and traditions. This month we'll explore some of these customs and traditions, and their sources.

An interesting article about time was in the magazine Scientific American titled "Real Time" by Gary Stix [Sept.

2002 issue] makes some harsh observations regarding human nature and time. The article brings to attention the advent of things like Federal Express, cell phones and computers [with which we may now multitask with many simultaneously] and how this has effected mankind as a whole. "*Time has, in essence, triumphed over space*", he states. The article is pre-concluded in the comment regarding the introduction of Federal Express and has only gotten faster since.



FedEx example: *At first, FedEx gave its customers an edge. But soon the whole world expected goods to arrive next morning. "When everyone adopted overnight mail, equality was restored," Gleich writes, "and only the universally faster pace remained."*

So here we are reeling into another winter season at a faster pace than before? Perhaps you recall the words of a kinder time that harbored thoughts to "keep things simple". Here are some hopefully numerous quotes from some famous and some infamous personalities

We can rest easy knowing that the Biblical calendar times are still as sure as the signs in the heavens that God originally placed there for us to use, and at the same regular pace and relevance to our seasons as they were from the beginning regardless of slight variances - it is the Earth that now wobbles after all, not the universe!

Onward to the data.

The data:

On **December 24, 2003** at about 5:30 PM Jerusalem, Israel should see chodesh 10 [new moon 10] with a 2-3% illumination. Around the

globe that same day the new moon should appear at about 5:30 PM - Western USA [MST] time. The new moon will have about a 4% illumination by the time it becomes visible to the Western States. It will be visible just after sunset at most location throughout the USA the evening of **December 24**.

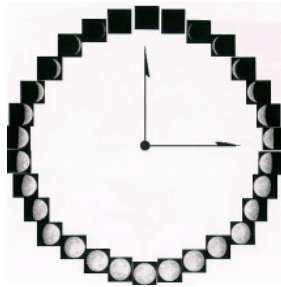
Note the date shown above in the right box of the banner. I've displayed the daytime date as opposed to the preceding days date for the new

moon sighting. The first DAY is best represented by naming the daytime date which started [by biblical definition] at sunset the evening before. I'm just trying to be numerically correct as opposed to say, stating the year of "0". There really wasn't any year "0"; the year was either -1 or +1 at all times. This chodesh **10** begins Biblical calendar month "ten". Why is it month **10** and not 9 or 11? Names of the Month

The Roman calendar month **December -- the tenth month**

Middle English *decembre*
Old French *decembre*
Latin *december* "tenth month"
Latin *decem* "ten" + *-ber* (adj. suffix)

December had 30 days, until Numa when it had 29 days, until Julius when it became 31 days long.

When you look at September, October, November and December, it seems as if the Romans couldn't count! But their year used to start in March. When Julius Caesar reorganised the calendar and made it start in January, he kept the old

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names, apart from one month, which he called after himself. The Romans had special names for the first day in the month (the Kalends), the seventh day (the Nones) and the fifteenth (the Ides). The Kalends belonged to [Juno](#). The Ides belonged to [Jupiter](#).

A brief history of the Roman calendar months:

The original Roman year had **10** named months *Martius* "March", *Aprilis* "April", *Maius* "May", *Junius* "June", *Quintilis* "July", *Sextilis* "September", *October* "October", *November* "November", *December* "December", and probably two unnamed months in the dead of winter when not much happened in agriculture. The year began with *Martius* "March". Numa Pompilius, the second king of Rome circa 700 BC, added the two months *Januarius* "January" and *Februarius* "February". He also moved the beginning of the year from *Marius* to *Januarius* and changed the number of days in several months to be odd, a lucky number. After *Februarius* there was occasionally an additional month of

Intercalaris "intercalendar".

This is the origin of the leap-year day being in February. In 46 BC, Julius Caesar reformed the Roman calendar (hence the Julian calendar) changing the number of days in many months and removing *Intercalaris*. "August",

The Jewish calendar month

Strong's Hebrew 2320 - chodesh kho'-desh from [2318](#); the new moon; by implication, a month:--month(-ly), new moon; and Abib means green ears of grain. The *biblical calendar* month is similar to the Jewish calendar moon [month] **10**:

Biblical events referencing the phrase "tenth month":

(Gen 8:5) And the waters decreased continually until the tenth month: in the tenth *month*, on the first *day* of the month, were the tops of the mountains seen.

ninth year, in the tenth month, in the tenth *day* of the month, the word of the LORD came unto me, saying,

Note from the author: The differences of the traditional Hebrew calendar, the Biblical and the Roman calendars reveal much regarding the histories and customs of their respective authors. We today use the civil Roman calendar for our commerce and governments with almost global acceptance. However, for the Bible student it should be noted that there are several factions among each of the faiths thus the sometimes confusing and differing names of the months, seasons,

beginning of years including sometimes even the **Holy Days**.

The Modern Birthstone list contains the official birthstone list from the American National Association of Jewelers, [Jewelers of America](#). These gemstones were officially adopted in 1912. In the US, this is the accepted list.

The Traditional Birthstone list contains older birthstones and is sometimes combined with the modern birthstone list. These

stones reflect societal birthstone traditions, heralding back to the 15th century. (Many jewelers have differing lists of traditional birthstones.)

The Mystical Birthstone list is of Tibetan origin from over a thousand years ago.

The Ayurvedic Birthstone list is from Ayurvedic Indian Medicine - a type of medicine used for over a thousand years.

Stones listed in the "other" column were correlated by Dave Thompson and others participating on the usenet newsgroup rec.crafts.jewelry as alternative birthstones for each month. Christian [Traditional] : CHRISTMAS comes from the early English phrase CHRISTES MASSE, which means CHRIST'S MASS.

December 25 was the day the Feast of Saturn, birthday of the sun, was celebrated. But Christians celebrated the birthday of the Son--the Light of the World. For many years, Christ's birthday was a religious celebration only, but eventually people began to adopt customs unrelated to the Saviour's birth ... *the Puritans did away with the observance of Christmas by law in 1643. Christmas became a national holiday by an act of Congress in 1870!*

Roman Catholic : New Years Day (until 12th century)

Question: With the holidays here and pounds gained, how many calories do you have to burn to lose a pound of fat?

AnsWER: It takes about 3,500 calories to gain or lose a pound of



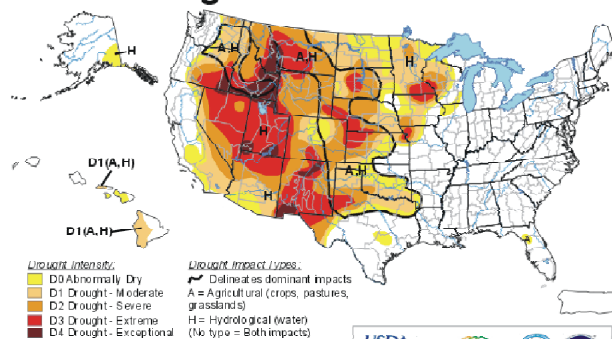
fat. To give you an idea of how much energy it takes to "burn" a calorie, here are a few activities with the number of calories they burn per minute, per pound of body weight: fast ax chopping (or cross-country skiing uphill), 0.135; forking straw bales (or playing basketball), 0.063; window cleaning (or playing croquet), 0.026. So a 150-pound person forking straw bales burns 9.45 calories per minute, which means he or she must fork bales for six hours to lose one pound. (Though not listed, the one exercise guaranteed to prevent calories needing burning is pushing one's chair away from the table!)

individual requires varies from person to person, but most adults average eight hours of sleep.

Sleep plays a vital role in our daily regimen, as during this dormant period, it recharges and rejuvenates weary body organs and tissues, and restores the body to an alert state. A person's lifestyle is another variable in the amount of time he needs to achieve this healthy balance, and to feel well rested upon awakening.

The quality of a person's sleep also factors into the sleep equation. When we drift off to sleep, we either fall into a deep, restful sleep, or into a shallow, light sleep. One who normally requires eight hours of sleep, but sleeps shallowly, will most likely awaken feeling tired. In contrast, if the same individual sleeps fewer hours, but lapses into a state of deep sleep, he may well awaken refreshed and invigorated.

A lucky few can bypass shallow sleep altogether, and fall directly into deep sleep on an as needed basis. Alexander the Great's military prowess may have been due, in part, to his ability to take a "cat nap."

Yet one more variable factors into the amount of sleep we require: that of the brain and of the body sleeping simultaneously. Under normal circumstances, the brain's sleep center blocks off the nerves to the brain and to the body to make sleep possible. The brain has no interest in doing anything, and could not even if it did, because the sleep center

has shut down the internal organs, the arms, and the legs. Sometimes, however, the sleep center is unsuccessful in shutting down both the brain and the body at the same time. For example, in times of war, it is not unusual for soldiers suffering from sleep deprivation and from combat fatigue to continue to march, despite the fact that their brains have halted. Thankfully, such a situation is an anomaly, and does not occur with



great frequency.

THE FEAST OF DEDICATION

From the **JFB Commentary:**
Joh 10:22-23 -
DISCOURSE AT THE

it was . . . the feast of the dedication--celebrated rather more than two months after the feast of tabernacles, during which intermediate period our Lord seems to have remained in the

neighborhood of Jerusalem. It was instituted by Jude Maccabeus, to commemorate the purification of the temple from the profanations to which it had been subjected by Antiochus Epiphanes 165 B.C., and kept for eight days, from the twenty-fifth Chisleu (December), the day on which Judas began the first joyous celebration of it (I Maccabees 4:52, 56, 59; and JOSEPHUS, Antiquities, 7.7.7). **it was winter**--implying some inclemency.

Therefore, it is noted that Christ did stay near Jerusalem and appeared at the Feast of Dedications only to be confronted by the "Jews" of that Temple to which He stated to them **[KJV, John 10:26]** But ye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you. **John 10:27** My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:

To this He was confronted by those Jews,

Joh 10:31 Then the Jews took up stones again to stone him.

Jesus was there but did not remain by reason of persecution by the Jews. No doubt, Himself being of the blood of the tribe of Judah - descendant of David, He was taught about the custom of this commemoration. It is my opinion that He was there to acknowledge the commemoration of the *feast of dedication* as He was taught by His mother and father, as was the custom of the people of Judah to teach their children of these matters. However, it is also plain

that the commemoration itself was neither an holy day or a sabbath. The *feast of dedications* seems to be most similar to the custom of Thanksgiving Day created in 1621 by the Pilgrims of the then future Republic of the United States. There are other national feast days of types in other nations upon the Earth also, during which they too give thanks to their gods for blessings and their posterity. I do not say this to make similar the feast of dedications to the latter, but to demonstrate that people too can create a commemoration among themselves - as in the Annual Fire Fighters Memorial meeting in Colorado Springs, CO which commemorates the fallen among them and honors those who perished while in their duty of service, for example.

So, while it is well documented that Christ was at the Temple during the time of the *feast of dedications*, it would still seem only a conjecture on my part or anyone else's to state that this was the **only** purpose that He attended the Temple during that time. The scripture does not say that Christ did in fact observe the *feast of dedication* for the full eight days as did the Maccabees in their re-dedication. No, He went off to beyond the Jordan River and abode for a time ... including during the time of the event itself [**John 10:40**].

So what are the commemorations, memorials and Holy Days mentioned in the Bible? Which days are Christians to keep and

observe? Let's read on for a moment longer.

Introduction

By far the best way to determine the real interests of a person is to note the festivals that he/she attends. Festivals are generally happy events, when people with similar interests assemble to celebrate something.

At a festival all the age-old barriers of race, colour and class are usually swept aside as people give themselves over to the "spirit of the occasion". And so we have music festivals, sports festivals, film festivals, wine festivals, carnivals, fetes, fairs, religious festivals and Feasts of various kinds. Indeed there is a festival to suit almost every taste and they are all normally well attended.

Festivals are often held to commemorate some important event, and in this connection they may be referred to as memorial festivals. Many religious festivals fall into this category; they are 'memorial festivals' held to commemorate the actions of the various Gods people worship. This study is of the Feast Days of Yahweh the Holy One of Israel, the Creator of the mighty universe, the LORD God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob; the One who is intensely interested in the welfare of every soul on earth. Yes, **the Almighty has certain memorials. He calls them 'My**

Feasts; for they are the Sacred Memorial Banquets of His greatest acts in the Programme of Salvation; banquets to which all His subjects are invited.

Leviticus 23:1-4 **And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying. "Speak unto the children of Israel, and say unto them, Concerning the Feasts of the LORD, which ye shall proclaim to be holy convocations, even these are MY FEASTS! ... These are the Feasts of the LORD, even holy convocations, which ye shall proclaim in their seasons."**

Note the Almighty's words "These are My Feasts" and "These are the Feasts of the LORD." Undoubtedly Yahweh's festivals were initially given to the people of Israel, for it was His plan that through them salvation was to be proclaimed to the world. But **the feasts themselves are the LORD'S, not Israel's or Judah's, but Yahweh's. Remember this vital fact.**

Unlike the popular festivals of Ash Wednesday, Easter, Hallowe'en and Christmas, whose observance is nowhere commanded in the Scriptures, the Feast Days of Yahweh are described in the Bible in considerable detail. They are to be proclaimed to and observed by all true believers in the LORD God of Israel. **Read about these sacred memorials in Leviticus 23, Numbers 28 & 29 and Zechariah 14.**

There you will see overwhelming evidence of their divine origin and

everlasting nature. Stewarton Bible School's [and To the Saints of the Churches of God] aim is to draw the church's attention to these appointed feasts of the Most High; to proclaim them to all the world in accordance with this divine direction:

Leviticus 23:4 **"These are the feasts of the LORD, even holy convocations, which ye shall proclaim in their seasons."**

A holy convocation is a commanded assembly. In other words, you are commanded to attend and join with fellow worshippers of the God of Israel. This publication is part of that proclamation. It outlines the reasons why you should attend the Feasts of the Holy One of Israel.



What do these sacred feasts commemorate? - Upper and lower case letters are named 'upper' and 'lower', because in the times when all original print had to be set in individual letters, the 'upper case' letters were stored in the case on top, and the smaller, 'lower case' letters on bottom.
- Seoul, the South Korean capital, just means "the capital" in the Korean language.
- The name of all the continents end with the same letter that they start with.

the course of Abia. What is meant by "the course of Abia?"

The "**course of Abia**" (**Abijah** in Hebrew) we learn from 1 Chronicles 24:7-10, was the 8th of 24 courses during a 12 month year. Each group of priests (all except the most senior who were on duty more often) officiated in the Temple for **two weeks** every year. **Zacharias'** turn of duty came when the 8th group (**Abijah's**) attended; which was during weeks **15** and **16** after the start of the year.

A year in the sacred calendar begins with the **new moon nearest the spring equinox**.

Consequently the new year starts in March or very early April. For the purpose of this study we will work with the equinox date of 20th March. Fifteen weeks (105 days) after the 20th March bring us to early July. In other words, **in early July** the angel Gabriel told

Zachariah that his aged wife Elisabeth would conceive and bear a son, whose name was to be **John**. **Six months into Elisabeth's pregnancy**, that is in early January, **Gabriel** informed the virgin **Mary** that she also was to conceive and bring forth a son, **the Son of the Highest - the Messiah!** When **Mary** said that this was not possible as she had never had sexual intercourse with a man, **Gabriel** told her that the aged **Elisabeth**, who had been barren for many, many years, was already **six months pregnant** - another apparent impossibility with man, but not with God. **For with God nothing shall be impossible!**

Luke 1:26: And in the sixth month the angel Gabriel was sent from God unto a city of Galilee, named Nazareth,

27: To a virgin espoused to a man whose name

was Joseph, of the house of David; and the virgin's name was Mary.

28: And the angel came in unto her, and said, Hail, thou that art highly favoured, the Lord is with thee: blessed art thou among women.

29: And when she saw him, she was troubled at his saying, and cast in her mind what manner of salutation this should be.

35: *And the angel answered and said unto her, The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the **Son of God.***

36: *And, behold, thy cousin Elisabeth, she hath also conceived a son in her old age: and this is the sixth month with her, who was called barren.*

From the above passages we learn, amongst other things, three vital facts:

- Elisabeth conceived in early **July**.
- Mary conceived some 6 months after Elisabeth, in early **January**.
- Therefore **Jesus**

was born just over 9 months later; which brings us to an autumn date in **late September/early October.**

From the above scriptural evidence it is certain that Jesus Christ was not born on the 25th December but in the autumn of the year. Now this is an amazing fact because late September/early October coincides with the Week of Tabernacles, the most sacred week in the sacred calendar. (Leviticus 23:23-44) The Week of Tabernacles is a memorial of Israel's 40 years in the wilderness when the nation lived in 'tabernacles' (booths or tents) and when Jehovah took up residence in a 'tabernacle' which was pitched in the centre of the camp. That is the low-level memorial of

Tabernacles. The high-level reality of Tabernacles was when Yeshua the Son of the Highest, the Messiah, GOD INCARNATE, took up residence in a frail human body. In other words, God 'tabernacled' with mankind in the person of His Son - Jesus Christ!
